The young learners' activity box (3 to 7-year-olds)

Teachers will participate in a very practical session, where they are going to walk, run, jump... and talk in English. This session will cover different activities and games related to body and language. Easy and fun activities for Primary school pupils that can provide an instant enjoyable learning experience.

Skills for CLIL: skills for teaching and learning in the CLIL classroom
(10 to 12-year-olds)

What skills do we need as CLIL teachers that we didn't or don't need as pure language or content teachers? What skills do we need to be aware of developing in our pupils as CLIL teachers that we didn't or don't need to be aware of in a purely language or content-teaching context? In this session, we will focus on key areas of academic and educational development and demonstrate how these areas can be practically and effectively developed so as to ensure a positive and successful learning experience in the CLIL classroom. Examples used in this session will focus mainly on 3rd cycle Primary social and natural science topics.

Key competences
(ESO)

This session will provide a detailed guide to key competences and will demonstrate that most teachers are already using key competences in many typical activities without realizing! We will give you useful tips and activities to incorporate the key competences into the 4 skills: reading, writing, listening and speaking. We will also look at ways to assess and evaluate them using technological resources such as wikis.

Katie Roberts

How to beat second term boredom!
(ESO & Batxillerat)

Whatever the age of the student, by the middle of term 2 you find that they start to lack enthusiasm. But don't worry! Here are some ideas and tips to keep your classes fresh, interesting but more importantly getting your students motivated again. The seminar will focus on getting teenagers to listen, concentrate and willing to participate in class by letting them take control within the parameters set by you.

Multi-level classes
(ESO & Batxillerat)

A workshop looking at all aspects of teaching in a multi-level class, including establishing the link between classroom management issues and weaker or stronger students, challenging initial assumptions about the different levels within the class. We will look at a number of practical classroom activities that make sure stronger and weaker students are challenged and learning as well as exploring the advantages and challenges of multi-level classes. The workshop will conclude with ten golden principles for teaching multi-level classes.
