## Sessions

### Faye Davies

#### What's in a story?

(3 to 7-year-olds)

We already know how useful stories, songs and games can be for children's language development but should they do more? The key competences (competencias básicas) remind us of the need to focus on the whole child in a way that takes account of their physical, intellectual, social and emotional learning needs. This session aims to demonstrate a range of story-related activities that enable children to develop key competences and suggests ways in which they might be evaluated.

### Paco Santos Juanes

#### When the body helps to acquire language

(6 to 12-year-olds)

Using our bodies can be a great resource to acquire language. Linking body actions and language facilitates language learning. Attendees will participate in a very practical session, where they are going to walk, run, jump... and talk in English. This session will cover different activities and games related to body and language. Easy and fun activities for Primary school pupils that can provide an instant enjoyable learning experience.

### Alistair Jones

#### Grammar games

(8 to 12-year-olds)

Children often find it difficult to acquire and use key grammar patterns and high-frequency chunks of language. The objective of this session is to present a selection of grammar games that get children learning at chunk, sentence and text level, beyond the individual word.



## Sessions

### Ester Boldú Grau

#### Key competences

(ESO)

This session will provide a detailed guide to key competences and will demonstrate that most teachers are already using key competences in many typical activities without realizing! We will give you useful tips and activities to incorporate the key competences into the 4 skills: reading, writing, listening and speaking. We will also look at ways to assess and evaluate them using technological resources such as wikis.

### Kate Pickering

#### Frameworks for speaking in Batxillerat: the control continuum

(Batxillerat)

Many Bachillerato students still fail to speak with confidence, something which is all the more important given the *Ampliación de Inglés* option. The session will look at a series of activity frameworks for supporting spoken output and increasing student confidence when speaking.

### Steven Muir

#### Telly learning

(ESO)

In this practical workshop we will look a range of classroom activities inspired by clips from film, TV and YouTube. These activities focus on a variety of language areas and skills, and can be adapted to use with many other clips. Most importantly, students seem to enjoy them!
